# Master's Degree Program "7M03111 – International Relations"

- **1. Name of the program:** Master's Degree Program "7M03111 International Relations" (training area: «7M031 Social Sciences»).
  - 2. Term of study: 1.5 years.3. Total credits (ECTS): 90.

### 4. Program description:

The Master's Degree Program in International Relations (hereinafter – the Program) is designed to meet the professional requirements for specialists in international relations and diplomacy while considering the specific activities of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

The Program is based on key strategic documents defining Kazakhstan's foreign policy priorities, including the *Kazakhstan 2050* Development Strategy and the Foreign Policy Concept of the Republic of Kazakhstan for 2020–2030.

Kazakhstan's diplomatic service faces new challenges and opportunities in today's geopolitical and geo-economic landscape. To respond effectively and promptly, the Kazakhstani diplomatic corps and other government officials engaged in international affairs must possess a multidisciplinary combination of knowledge and skills in various areas of international relations.

Accordingly, the Program aims to develop the following competencies: Kazakhstan's foreign policy; Diplomatic protocol and etiquette; Economic diplomacy; Public diplomacy; Foreign policy analysis; Conflict studies; Geopolitics and geo-economics; Negotiation techniques; Regional studies.

## 5. Aims and objectives of the program:

*Goal:* To train highly qualified international relations professionals capable of addressing Kazakhstan's foreign policy challenges and defending national interests on the global stage.

Objectives:

- -To develop professional competencies necessary for the effective implementation of Kazakhstan's foreign and economic policy agenda.
- -To provide a comprehensive and in-depth understanding of contemporary international processes, as well as Kazakhstan's role and position in regional and global politics.

#### 6. Benefits of the program:

- 1) Practice-oriented courses designed to enhance professional training through modern teaching methodologies;
- 2) Faculty includes experienced specialists and practitioners, including active and former diplomats (Ambassadors Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, Special Envoys, heads of structural divisions of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan, as well as experts from international organizations and analytical centers);
- 3) Participation in international forums and conferences, as well as regular meetings with ambassadors and heads of foreign diplomatic missions.
  - 4) Courses taught in three languages: Kazakh, Russian, and English.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan is a key partner in the implementation of this Program.

#### 7. Expected learning outcomes

Development of Competencies:

Effective Communication: Able to coordinate activities with colleagues, open to communication, demonstrates readiness for business collaboration, assists colleagues when needed, resolves conflicts constructively, articulates arguments clearly while considering others' perspectives, and efficiently organizes teamwork with stakeholders.

Adherence to Ethical Standards and Principles: Strictly follows ethical behavior rules in all situations following the code of ethics, upholds principles of integrity, honesty, goodwill, and respect towards colleagues and stakeholders; remains composed in stressful situations, seeking and finding solutions.

Change Management: Positively adapts to organizational changes, adjusts strategies based on evolving circumstances, analyzes reasons for setbacks modifies approaches accordingly, and supports and encourages employee initiatives.

Results Orientation: Sets ambitious goals and achieves them, makes extra efforts to accomplish tasks, and takes responsibility for delivering results.

Independence and Decision-Making Skills: Analyzes opportunities and risks, effectively plans and allocates resources, acts efficiently under uncertainty, and proposes multiple solutions while considering potential risks.

Collaboration: Contributes to team efforts, seeks clarification from experienced colleagues, when necessary, fosters cooperation with peers and representatives of government agencies and organizations, shares opinions, and incorporates feedback into task completion.

Responsiveness: Proposes improvements, explores new approaches and their implementation, and quickly adapts to changing conditions.

Teaching Methods, Formats, and Technologies: Discussions and debates, case studies, group work, thematic research, simulations, seminars, guest lectures, and field sessions.
